- (13) **TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS PRESENT:**

- (1) We appreciate your being here and helping our meeting
- (2) turn into a success.
- (3) I hope after all my years are done here I will
- (4) have at least one scout that steps up for Township
- (5) government. I would be so happy. My work would be
- (6) accomplished.
- (7) I would like to introduce the Township officials.
- (8) We'll start up here. We have Warren Dixon, our
- (9) Assessor, on the end. We have Stan Wojtasiak, our Road
- (10) Commissioner; Gary Vician, our Supervisor; and one
- (11) Trustee tonight, May Yurgiatis.
- (12) Esin was not able to be here tonight. She's one
- (13) of our other Trustees. She's out of town and has a new
- (14) job, and she's been traveling a lot more than she had
- (15) before. So she says hello to everyone and thank you
- (16) for your support for us.
- (17) Next, I think what we need to do now is establish
- (18) the salary for the Moderator. Do I hear someone that
- (19) will make that salary made?
- (20) **MR. DIXON:** I make a motion that we set a whopping
- (21) zero as the salary for the Moderator.
- (22) **MR. VICIAN:** I'll second that.

- (1) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Good evening, and welcome to
- (2) Naperville Township Annual Meeting. What we want to
- (3) start with, first of all, I'm just welcoming you, and I
- (4) would like everybody to, if they would, just bow their
- (5) heads in a moment of silence for the poor people in
- (6) Boston. I think they need our support here. Thank
- (7) you, everyone.
- (8) I welcome you tonight to our annual meeting,
- (9) April 16, 2013. It's kind of exciting. It's like the
- (10) last round-up for a few of us, and we're just happy to
- (11) see so many of you here tonight. We just are very
- (12) thankful for people that come out and support our
- (13) meetings and you give a chance to meet us in person if
- (14) you want to talk to us. You get a chance to hear
- (15) what's going on, and you could put your input into the
- (16) meeting, also.
- (17) Now, if we could just rise because we're going to
- (18) have a scout troop post the colors. This is Troop 81.
- (19) (Whereupon, the Colors were
- (20) Posted and the Pledge of
- (21) allegiance was said.)
- (22) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Thank you, gentlemen. Nice work.

- (1) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Would you please tell the young
- (2) lady your name and address.
- (3) **MR. DIXON:** Warren Dixon, Jr., 325 Cottonwood
- (4) Lane, Naperville, Illinois.
- (5) **MR. VICIAN:** Gary Vician, 737 Buttonwood Circle,
- (6) Naperville, Illinois.
- (7) **CLERK BERTULIS:** I guess I have to ask if there
- (8) are any other motions on that salary. Anyone want to
- (9) do anything else against the salary for zero? Hearing
- (10) none, all in favor?
- (11) (Chorus of ayes.)
- (12) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Those against? Thank you very
- (13) much. The salary is zero.
- (14) I think the next thing we want to do is a
- (15) nomination for the Moderator.
- (16) **MR. DIXON:** I would like to make a nomination for
- (17) the past Honorable Chairman of DuPage County, Bob
- (18) Schillerstrom.
- (19) **MR. HEALY:** Second.
- (20) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Your name, sir.
- (21) **MR. HEALY:** David Healy, 1205 Heatherton Drive,
- (22) Naperville, Illinois.

- (1) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Any more nominations from the
- (2) floor for Moderator? Are there any more nominations
- (3) from the floor for Moderator? Last call. Any more
- (4) nominations from the floor for Moderator?
- (5) **MR. VICIAN:** Move to close nominations.
- (6) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Tell her your name.
- (7) **MR. VICIAN:** Gary Vician.
- (8) **MR. HEALY:** Second. James Healy, 1205 Heatherton
- (9) Drive, Naperville, Illinois.
- (10) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Thank you. The nominations are
- (11) now closed. Let's take a vote on it. I guess we need
- (12) to --
- (13) **MR. DIXON:** I move that we unanimously nominate
- (14) Bob Schillerstrom.
- (15) **MR. VICIAN:** Second.
- (16) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Are there any other nominations
- (17) for that? Any other nomination for Moderator? All
- (18) those in favor for Robert Schillerstrom being our
- (19) Moderator tonight, raise your yellow cards.
- (20) Unanimous. Wonderful. I don't think we have to
- (21) do a vote. Just come right up.
- (22) **CLERK BERTULIS:** This is the oath for the

- (1) Moderator for the Town Meeting tonight.
- (2) (The oath was thereupon duly
- (3) administered to the Moderator
- (4) by the Clerk.)
- (5) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Thank you.
- (6) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you, Carol. Good
- (7) evening. I want to thank you all for coming out to our
- (8) Annual Town Meeting for Naperville Township. I
- (9) appreciate you giving up an evening of your time, and
- (10) this is grassroots politics at its very, very best.
- (11) I will attempt to give anyone who wants to speak
- (12) tonight an opportunity to speak. Catch my eye, and if
- (13) I miss you one time going around, I'll try to get you
- (14) the next time. I will ask you to keep your remarks
- (15) short and to the point so, if other people want to
- (16) speak, there's enough time to do that.
- (17) We will proceed to the first item on the agenda,
- (18) and that is the appointment of a Parliamentarian. I
- (19) will select Mr. Kurt Dorr to be our Parliamentarian.
- (20) Kurt, would you please stand up, and would you
- (21) spell your name for the court reporter, please.
- (22) **MR. DORR:** K-U-R-T. Last name, D-O-R-R.

- (1) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you. All right. We
- (2) will now move onto approval of minutes from the
- (3) April 10, 2012 Annual Town Meeting. Mr. Healy.
- (4) **MR. HEALY:** So moved.
- (5) **MR. MARGOLIS:** Motion to amend.
- (6) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Is there a second?
- (7) **MR. VICIAN:** Second.
- (8) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** It's been moved and seconded.
- (9) The movant is Mr. James Healy, and Mr. Vician is the
- (10) seconder. We're now open for discussion.
- (11) **MR. MARGOLIS:** I move to amend the minutes to add
- (12) the registration list to comply with the Open Meetings
- (13) Act.
- (14) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Tell us exactly what you want
- (15) in the minutes and where you want them.
- (16) **MR. MARGOLIS:** I want it attached to the minutes
- (17) by reference who was present as voters, registration
- (18) list.
- (19) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** The registration list of
- (20) everyone who signed in at the 2012 meeting or the 2013
- (21) meeting?
- (22) **MR. MARGOLIS:** 2012.

- (1) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Do you have a copy of that?
- (2) **MR. MARGOLIS:** No.
- (3) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** There's been a motion made to
- (4) amend the minutes to add the list of registrants or the
- (5) people who are eligible to vote at the 2012 meeting.
- (6) Is there a second to that motion to amend the minutes?
- (7) **MS. SWANSON:** I'll second.
- (8) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Very well. It's been moved
- (9) and seconded. First of all, is there any discussion on
- (10) the amendment?
- (11) **MR. VICIAN:** Point of information. Is that list
- (12) available?
- (13) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** I presume it's available. I
- (14) don't know that it's available tonight. Does anyone
- (15) have that here tonight? It's not here tonight.
- (16) Evidently, it does exist, so it can be appended to the
- (17) minutes if the motion to amend carries.
- (18) Sir, would you state your name, please.
- (19) **MR. ALAN:** Ronald Alan. I wanted to know the
- (20) names and addresses of those people that made the
- (21) motion and seconded.
- (22) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** That's a fair thing. Sir,

- (1) would you please rise and state your name and address.
- (2) **MR. MARGOLIS:** Eric Margolis, 3045 Timber Hill
- (3) Court, Aurora.
- (4) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Would you be good enough to
- (5) spell your name for the court reporter.
- (6) **MR. MARGOLIS:** M-A-R-G-O-L-I-S.
- (7) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you. Ma'am, would you
- (8) also give us your name and address and spell your last
- (9) name.
- (10) **MS. SWANSON:** Cynthia Swanson, S-W-A-N-S-O-N.
- (11) 519 North Webster.
- (12) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Is there any other discussion
- (13) regarding the motion to amend the minutes by appending
- (14) the list of registrants from 2012? Yes, sir.
- (15) **MR. RICKARD:** Are you asking for the people who
- (16) were registered to vote at that time or people who
- (17) showed up at the meeting?
- (18) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** No. We're going to add that
- (19) to the minutes.
- (20) **MR. RICKARD:** The people who showed up at the
- (21) meeting?
- (22) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Who were able to vote. There

- (1) may have been people who came who were not able to
- (2) vote. When you came tonight, you signed in. You
- (3) became a registrant. They want the list from 2012.
- (4) Would you state your name for the record, sir.
- (5) **MR. RICKARD:** I'm Paul Rickard. 1215 Birchdale
- (6) Lane, Aurora, R-I-C-K-A-R-D.
- (7) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you. Is there any other
- (8) discussion?
- (9) **MR. DIXON:** Mr. Chairman.
- (10) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Yes, sir. Mr. Dixon.
- (11) **MR. DIXON:** I would like to ask the Clerk, Carol.
- (12) Did we have that list? Is that list still available?
- (13) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Yes, but it's at the office.
- (14) **MR. DIXON:** As long as you have the list. I just
- (15) wanted to make sure.
- (16) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** I think it's understood the
- (17) list is not here.
- (18) **MR. DIXON:** So it's not something that the list is
- (19) not available.
- (20) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Any further -- yes, sir, in
- (21) the very back, please stand up and state your name.
- (22) **MR. POTTER:** Craig Potter. My only question is,

- (1) besides the name and number information, private
- (2) information, phone numbers and that, and the
- (3) distribution could be an issue.
- (4) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** No. There's nothing private
- (5) on this. The only thing that's on there is the list of
- (6) the people who registered; and if it's like this year,
- (7) I believe the address is there. There's no other
- (8) information whatsoever on it.
- (9) Correct? That's what you want appended? It's
- (10) just the document that was signed.
- (11) **MR. MARGOLIS:** I only want it to apply with the
- (12) Open Meetings Act.
- (13) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Any other discussion?
- (14) **MR. RICKARD:** We can't make this decision until
- (15) the vote -- until the list has been presented.
- (16) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** That is out of order. You can
- (17) vote no but a motion to amend is out of order. If
- (18) there's no further discussion, we're going to proceed
- (19) to vote on the amendment. A yes vote would mean that
- (20) the list would be appended as soon as the minutes are
- (21) brought back to the Township office. A no vote means
- (22) they would not.

- (1) All those in favor of the amendment, please raise
- (2) your right hand, holding your yellow card.
- (3) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** All right. I have 29. All
- (4) those opposed, please raise your right hand. I have 13
- (5) nos. The amendment carries.
- (6) We will proceed to the main motion as amended, and
- (7) that is to approve the minutes with the registration.
- (8) Is there any further discussion on the main motion as
- (9) amended? Hearing nothing, we will once again proceed
- (10) to vote on that. Please hold up your cards if you're
- (11) voting in favor of the minutes as amended. Opposed?
- (12) The motion carries. The minutes as amended are
- (13) approved.
- (14) Madam Clerk, I would ask that you make sure that,
- (15) when you get back to the Township offices, that you
- (16) append the list of the 2012 registration registrants.
- (17) We will now proceed to old business. Is there any
- (18) old business to come before the body? Hearing no old
- (19) business, we will now proceed to new business.
- (20) The first item is the Green Acres Homeowners
- (21) Association presentation, and I would ask Janet and
- (22) George to please come forward.

(1) **MR. BENNETT:** Thank you, Mr. Schillerstrom. I am
(2) George Bennett. For the last nearly 40 years, I have
(3) been privileged to have lived in unincorporated
(4) Naperville Township, the last 18 of which serving on
(5) the board of the Green Acres Homeowners Association and
(6) until last Saturday as the president of that
(7) association.

(8) I can say that it has been fantastic over the
(9) course of many years to work with so many of the very
(10) dedicated Township officials, some of whom are here
(11) tonight.

(12) I would definitely like to recognize Carol
(13) Bertulis, a friend of mine, Clerk; Gary Vician,
(14) Supervisor; Stan Wojtasiak; and, of course, Warren
(15) Dixon and May Yurgiatis; and those who are not here,
(16) Esin Busche, Fred Spitzzeri, and Dave Wentz, who, of
(17) course, is at a very important council meeting.

(18) The Green Acres presentation has become a
(19) tradition, a tradition that I hope will continue in a
(20) similar vein, as I hope that the cooperation over the
(21) years that I have been involved with this association
(22) will continue with a new group of Township officials,

(1) many of whom are here tonight and who, I hope, everyone
(2) in this room will have a chance to get to know over the
(3) coming years.

(4) Now I would like to turn this presentation over to
(5) Janet Wehrli, who is a lifelong Naperville resident
(6) of Green Acres, and the new president of Green Acres
(7) Incorporated.

(8) **MS. WEHRLI:** Thank you. I've been president for
(9) two days, so I will probably be showing that in my
(10) presentation. I just want to echo what George said.
(11) We certainly thank the Township for all their services
(12) and cooperation.

(13) On behalf of the Green Acres Homeowners
(14) Association, this year's gift with the help of a very
(15) kind Township employee, we have offered to help
(16) beautify the already beautiful building downtown by
(17) putting planters in the front of the entrance there.
(18) The better flowers are out in a few weeks, so these are
(19) just a few pansies for somebody to plant. We will be
(20) putting in the next few weeks some planters in front of
(21) the building downtown. So thank you, again, very much.

(22) (Applause.)

(1) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you, Janet, and thank
(2) you, George, and also all of the members of the Green
(3) Acres Homeowners Association.

(4) This has become sort of an annual event, and we
(5) thank you for your generosity to the Township, and,
(6) Janet, we'll look to see you next year.

(7) We will now proceed to reports and introductions
(8) of employees, and I'm going to give it to Carol first
(9) to introduce her employees.

(10) **CLERK BERTULIS:** Thank you, Bob. Actually, it's
(11) just myself pretty much. The Clerk's job is to take
(12) care of the records, attend the meetings, keep the
(13) information collected and the other things that I
(14) have -- well, I brought in writing passports, which has
(15) been quite successful. We make a little bit of money
(16) on that, but it's a nice service for people. I'm told
(17) it's much easier to come and get a passport at the
(18) Township than the post office, so I feel happy when I
(19) hear that.

(20) Voter registration. I still go to the high
(21) schools because, if I don't get them there, I see them
(22) when they're 25, 30 years old, sometimes 50, and

(1) they've never voted, which breaks my heart. I have a
(2) son who fights for that freedom. He's in the army.
(3) He's very avid. He always sends his vote in, and he
(4) was a little upset this time when he got his ballot.
(5) He said, "Who's the clerk? There's no clerk on here."
(6) I said, "The clerk is retiring. So that's that."

(7) Anyway, like I said, I like to go to the high
(8) schools because I like to be able to get these kids
(9) signed up so they can use that freedom to vote.

(10) The other thing, like I said, we do the passports
(11) down there at the office now, and that's a good feeling
(12) that people are happy to have that service. So I thank
(13) everybody for their support over the years, and keep
(14) supporting Township government. It's wonderful.

(15) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you, Carol. All right.
(16) Next, I will ask our Highway Commissioner,
(17) Mr. Wojtasiak, to come forward and introduce his
(18) employees.

(19) **COMMISSIONER WOJTASIAK:** You've got me for four
(20) more years. Thank you.

(21) (Applause.)

(22) **COMMISSIONER WOJTASIAK:** I would like to thank

(1) everyone that came out and voted for our team. Even if
(2) you didn't vote for our team, I have to thank you
(3) anyway. You took advantage of a right that we have to
(4) protect. Actually, we had a 14 percent voter turnout
(5) in Naperville, which means we're going to have
(6) 86 percent bunch of complainers out there for the next
(7) four years about government.

(8) I would like to introduce my employees. First of
(9) all, my wife Jean. She's not an employee, but she's
(10) here somewhere, back there at the giveaway table.
(11) Cathy DiSanto, my right arm in the office. She's been
(12) with the Township about 30 years, right?

(13) **MS. DISANTO:** Going on 31.

(14) **COMMISSIONER WOJTASIAK:** Going on 31. Pat Testin,
(15) Joe Bentham, Dave Marshall, John Donovan, our newest
(16) employee, Larry Wayner, and noticeably missing tonight
(17) is Paul Reis, who retired last June. He got tired of
(18) pushing snow around. Of course, he's only been doing
(19) it 38 years, so I guess it was time.

(20) A couple projects we have going this year. Last
(21) year, we did Phase 1 drainage in Longwood. This year
(22) we're continuing that into Phase 2. We put in a new

(1) will be around for a while to do the books this up and
(2) coming year.

(3) This up and coming year we plan on reducing
(4) assessments again. The assessments will be reduced by
(5) about 4 percent this year on average, so they will be
(6) going down. Unfortunately, the taxes wouldn't be going
(7) down.

(8) In the tax bill you will be getting out, the tax
(9) rates have gone up considerably, and the tax bills will
(10) be going up a little bit. Not as bad, but as you can
(11) see the last three years, we've gone down with the
(12) assessment. So saying that, a little bit about the
(13) assessment process and where we're at.

(14) I would like to introduce my employees and my
(15) newest employee, Lucy Liesen. Lucy is in the back.
(16) Next, Deb Torrey, and we've got Ken Jackson running
(17) around here with the camera. Bob Longacre is in Lisle
(18) at his town meeting over in Lisle.

(19) We've got Jim Donovan. Where is Jim? There's
(20) Jim. Jim is going to be retiring. He's my Deputy
(21) Assessor. He's retiring with a couple others. Mary
(22) Agnes Dixon, she retired with us last year after many

(1) drainage system in Long Meadow Subdivision, and just to
(2) show you how we've progressed in the past couple years,
(3) this is the way we used to cut grass. This is the way
(4) we do it now. Big difference.

(5) Thanks, again, for four more years, and I
(6) appreciate everyone and what they do for us in the
(7) Township. Thank you.

(8) (Applause.)

(9) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Next, we will have our
(10) Assessor, Mr. Warren Dixon, Junior. Warren.

(11) **MR. DIXON:** Thank you, Bob. Thank you, and I
(12) would like to congratulate all the newly elected
(13) officials. The only ones that are up there that are
(14) still left for a while will be Stan, actually
(15) re-elected four years. The rest of us will be changing
(16) hands.

(17) I have had a lot of questions, saying, "Thanks,
(18) but what are you going to do with retirement?" Well,
(19) I'm not retired yet. The Assessor will be here until
(20) December 31st. That's my last day of office. So the
(21) new Assessor, Assessor-to-be, Assessor-elect, Warren L.
(22) Dixon, III, will be taking my place on January 1. So I

(1) years with us, and so did Paula McMenamin retired prior
(2) to that.

(3) Now Jim Donovan is kind of the little bit of the
(4) last chain retiring on me in the end of September. So
(5) I would be losing my Chief Deputy the end of September,
(6) which I'll miss.

(7) The only other one I'm missing is Lynne Willer is
(8) not here with us tonight. She's out in Sandwich, where
(9) she lives.

(10) I would like to clarify some things a little bit.

(11) I want to say that, over the last 28 years -- and I've
(12) been Assessor for 28 years -- that we have maintained
(13) the accuracy on the assessments.

(14) Despite what you may have seen or read in the
(15) paper -- and it can be verified with the Supervisor of
(16) Assessments -- we have been consistently number one or
(17) number two in the State of Illinois and number one
(18) clearly as far as large jurisdictions on assessed
(19) valuation as far as accuracy is concerned.

(20) My people, although a very small number, six
(21) people, service more parcels than any other township
(22) per parcel. We service over 5,000 parcels for those

(1) six individual employees. They do a whale of a job and
 (2) have done a whale of a job doing that.
 (3) Over the last several years, we've only increased
 (4) our budget on an average of 1.9 percent per year over
 (5) the last seven years. The Township budget this year is
 (6) going up 10 percent, but I reduced the Assessor's
 (7) budget by 5 percent this up and coming year.
 (8) We also, during that period of time, were saved
 (9) because we haven't spent the amount of budget that
 (10) we've had. We've saved over the last seven years about
 (11) \$400,000 that we didn't spend.
 (12) So we're very proud of those statistics along with
 (13) it. Hopefully, I've done a great job for you. This
 (14) will be my last town meeting for you. You've all been
 (15) great to me.
 (16) 28 years of being Assessor means you get a lot of
 (17) people that don't agree with you all the time, but I'll
 (18) tell you, it's really been a blessing. I've really
 (19) only had a very minute -- on one hand I can count
 (20) people that I've disagreed with or that we haven't
 (21) gotten along over the years. We've had some very
 (22) heated discussions, but we've also had some very

(1) fruitful and beneficial things that have happened and
 (2) transpired. I'm very proud of that and very proud of
 (3) people allowing me to be your Assessor for that many
 (4) years and being able to work with you. So on that
 (5) note, I'll sit down, and I thank you very much for the
 (6) time.
 (7) One more thing. I've got to thank my wife.
 (8) Otherwise, I'll be in big trouble, because she put up
 (9) with me for 28 years doing this, longer than that. I
 (10) want to thank Katie Dixon, my wife, very much for
 (11) staying with me.
 (12) (Applause.)
 (13) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** I'm going to ask May to come
 (14) up to say a quick word on behalf of the Trustee.
 (15) **MS. YURGIATIS:** Good evening, everyone. Thank you
 (16) very much, all of you, for coming out tonight. I am
 (17) speaking on behalf of all the Trustees when I say it's
 (18) been an absolute privilege and pleasure to be a Trustee
 (19) in Naperville Township. I enjoyed serving you, and
 (20) thank you very much for your support. I completed two
 (21) terms, and since I'm a believer in term limits at this
 (22) level of government, my time is up. So thank you again

(1) very much.
 (2) (Applause.)
 (3) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Last, but certainly not least,
 (4) our Supervisor, Mr. Gary Vician.
 (5) **MR. VICIAN:** Thank you, Bob. Thank you all for
 (6) being here tonight. I appreciate every time the
 (7) community comes out, and you're a great community.
 (8) Before I get started on letting you know about my
 (9) staff, I would like to recognize your next group of
 (10) elected officials that are here. If they could stand
 (11) up as I go around the room and announce them. That
 (12) way, when we're done, you can make sure to talk to
 (13) them.
 (14) We've got Trustee Janice Anderson. Carrie Mulm is
 (15) here. Paul Santucchi is here. Is Dan Wagner here? I
 (16) don't know if I saw him.
 (17) Rachel Ossyra for Supervisor, and Barry Greenberg
 (18) as the Clerk, and Warren Dixon, III. Where is Warren?
 (19) He's right there.
 (20) Give them all a hand.
 (21) (Applause.)
 (22) **MR. VICIAN:** They will serve you very well, like

(1) the outgoing individuals are.
 (2) Now for my staff that's here. My very valuable
 (3) assistant, Francie Chiriko, is in back there. Millie
 (4) Rodriguez. Stand up. That way, we can see you.
 (5) Millie Rodriguez handles the assistance programs, and
 (6) she is the smartest person in the office. She knows
 (7) more about everything than anyone, including myself, so
 (8) a very valuable person. And she's covered so many
 (9) different areas over the years. Really appreciate
 (10) that.
 (11) A new person, Holly Reuter, is here. Holly is
 (12) joining Millie helping out, and Jenny Dawley, who
 (13) really knows everything too, but she's been there a
 (14) shorter time. She's senior services, but she probably
 (15) understands everything too from her background in both
 (16) nursing and education.
 (17) Jan Barber, our number cruncher and another
 (18) phenomenal person helping seniors and veterans. She's
 (19) teamed up with another guy named Mike Barber, who also
 (20) has done groundbreaking work here at the Township and
 (21) the County. We've actually got some national
 (22) recognition that the Barbers and Jenny Dawley have done

- (1) with veterans helping out with jobs and all.
- (2) Ben Dixon is not here. He works our LIHEAP and
- (3) front desk. Helga Mattingly planning Lee didn't make
- (4) it here. Last but not least, Deputy Clerk and a good
- (5) guy, working in all kinds of things Joe Pomaranski.
- (6) Joe, raise your hand. Joe has done a great job helping
- (7) out Carol, too.
- (8) So we have a wonderful staff. They do a great
- (9) job. We're very proud to say that we have more
- (10) services today than when we came to office four years
- (11) ago, yet it cost less money to the taxpayers.
- (12) Our operating budget has been reduced each year.
- (13) We've managed to use the savings to pay off our debt,
- (14) and we've also returned money by cutting taxes, and we
- (15) abated a half million dollars this year in addition to
- (16) the tax cuts and savings.
- (17) The final thing we did, we looked at our needy
- (18) people in the community, and we increased giving things
- (19) like Loaves & Fishes to families in the 360 youth
- (20) services, so we did a lot to help other people out,
- (21) too.
- (22) I hope you all take a look at what we're doing,

- (1) and I hope you all say something to the new people
- (2) coming in and so we can continue the fine work that's
- (3) been going on.
- (4) Thank you very much for being here, and thank you
- (5) for letting me serve you.
- (6) (Applause.)
- (7) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you, Gary.
- (8) The next item on our agenda is the public forum.
- (9) This is where we open it up to anyone who wants to
- (10) speak, and I'll pretty much let you talk about anything
- (11) as long as you don't get personal with anyone else. I
- (12) would ask that you keep it to three minutes so
- (13) everybody has an opportunity to speak, and I see a
- (14) couple folks who have risen on this side. My guess is,
- (15) you want to speak first, right? So who wants to go
- (16) first?
- (17) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Yes, ma'am. Would you please
- (18) state your name and spell your last name and give us
- (19) your address, and then the floor is yours.
- (20) **SHARON COSTABILE:** This is my daughter, Rachel
- (21) Costabile, C-O-S-T-A-B-I-L-E. She lives at 318 West
- (22) Spring Avenue, Naperville.

- (1) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Rachel, the floor is yours.
- (2) **MS. COSTABILE:** Hi. My name is Rachel Costabile.
- (3) I am going to be 28 on August 20th. I want to tell you
- (4) how much I like using the bus to get to the places I
- (5) need to go. During the weekend, I use the Ride DuPage
- (6) bus to go to work. I will say I am excited about my
- (7) new job. North Central College in Naperville, I will
- (8) need to take the Ride DuPage bus on Saturday and Sunday
- (9) to North Central College.
- (10) Also, going to my haircut appointment, to the
- (11) dentist on the bus with Ride DuPage. On Monday and
- (12) Tuesday, I use the Ride DuPage bus to go to Rock and
- (13) Roll at Westrick program.
- (14) I like to schedule my own bus, make my own plans
- (15) every weekend, but the Ride DuPage bus helps me to be
- (16) independent and to take care of myself so my mom or dad
- (17) does not have to drive me everywhere. Thank you.
- (18) (Applause.)
- (19) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Next.
- (20) **SHARON COSTABILE:** My name is Sharon Costabile. I
- (21) also live at 318 West Spring in Naperville. I just
- (22) wanted to talk for a brief three minutes about how much

- (1) we appreciate the services of the Ride DuPage bus
- (2) system the Township provides for us.
- (3) Rachel has been very, very lucky to live in a
- (4) community where she can do all the things that she
- (5) does, and we specifically moved to Naperville for some
- (6) of these services from Wheaton.
- (7) The community that we have in Naperville here has
- (8) been really wonderful. We feel that we live in a great
- (9) village, and we've been very grateful for the services
- (10) that are provided and hope to see them continue. Thank
- (11) you.
- (12) (Applause.)
- (13) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** I see two others over here who
- (14) have risen to speak. Come on forward.
- (15) **MS. SWANSON:** My name is Cynthia Swanson,
- (16) S-W-A-N-S-O-N. I live at 519 North Webster Street,
- (17) Naperville, Illinois 60563.
- (18) 18 years ago, I lost my vision, and with that, I
- (19) also lost the ability to drive. You people do not want
- (20) me driving a car. For the last nearly decade, I've
- (21) been involved in Ride DuPage with a group of very
- (22) dedicated sponsors and advocates.

- (1) By using Ride DuPage, I'm able to get to work. I
- (2) go to doctors. I get my hair done. I get to visit
- (3) friends. I get to do all the things I would have been
- (4) able to do if I had not lost my vision.
- (5) Ride DuPage is an awesome hybrid for paratransit.
- (6) It lets us get to things we want to go to 24 hours a
- (7) day, wherever we want. It's a shared ride service.
- (8) It's a hybrid, and it's looked upon by other
- (9) communities in the state and in the country as
- (10) something that is a very, very usable, accessible kind
- (11) of a program.
- (12) Illinois is known nationwide as the worst state in
- (13) the country for supporting people with disabilities.
- (14) We are statistically in dead last. But when you look
- (15) at a community as blessed as Naperville and, indeed,
- (16) DuPage County, the fact we're able to get to places we
- (17) need to get to, we get to go to work, recreation, we
- (18) get to volunteer, I think that's the crown jewel of
- (19) DuPage. I am very thankful that we have the Naperville
- (20) partnership, which includes Lisle, Wheatland Naperville
- (21) Township, the City of Naperville, to provide the
- (22) service that allows people like myself. It also

- (1) provides services not only for people with
- (2) disabilities, but elderly, so we all want to be able to
- (3) live long enough to use Ride DuPage. So I'm
- (4) appreciative of that.
- (5) What's really important is the people we bring
- (6) forth in our lives, our children, and I'm so grateful
- (7) that Rachel gave such a wonderful presentation. But
- (8) I'm pretty biased. I'm very proud of my son, Adam
- (9) Swanson, who uses Ride DuPage.
- (10) So here you go. Tell the folks your name and
- (11) address.
- (12) **ADAM SWANSON:** Thank you, mom.
- (13) My name is Adam Swanson, S-W-A-N-S-O-N. I am from
- (14) Naperville. 519 North Webster Street in Naperville.
- (15) I use Ride DuPage to get me to work, cities like
- (16) Berwyn to see my friends and go to the doctor. I am
- (17) thankful for Ride DuPage because everyone gets to
- (18) places that are important. If you can drive, you can
- (19) get in your car and go. I don't drive. Ride DuPage
- (20) gives me the freedom to go places on my own, just like
- (21) you. Thank you.
- (22) (Applause.)

- (1) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** All right. Is there anyone
- (2) else who would like to address the body? I'm going to
- (3) get this young guy first, and then I'll get you. Not
- (4) that you're not a young guy.
- (5) **MR. PITSCHKE:** Hello. My name is Jason Pitschke.
- (6) I live at 1001 Campbell Drive in Naperville. I just
- (7) wanted to say thank you on behalf of Troop 81 for
- (8) allowing us to come here and do the flags for you guys.
- (9) We're really grateful that you give us the
- (10) opportunities to do these community service hours and
- (11) also for letting us store our trailer and other gear
- (12) here. We really appreciate it. Thank you.
- (13) (Applause.)
- (14) **MR. PURDUSKI:** Thank you, Mr. Schillerstrom. My
- (15) name is Steve Purduski, 846 North Webster Street in
- (16) Naperville. I was the Naperville Township Democratic
- (17) Organization candidate for Township Supervisor.
- (18) On behalf of my fellow candidates and the
- (19) Naperville Township Democratic Organization, first of
- (20) all, I would like to thank the outgoing officers for
- (21) their service over the years that they have put in and
- (22) the hard work that they put in.

- (1) I also would like to congratulate the incoming
- (2) officers for a very respectful campaign. A lot of
- (3) issues came forward, and I think we found that we
- (4) worked actually together quite well with them.
- (5) As we move forward, our candidates and the NTBO
- (6) are very concerned citizens, and we are planning on a
- (7) very active participation and we look to volunteer and
- (8) help wherever we can in township governments and look
- (9) forward to working very closely with the incoming
- (10) Board. Thanks.
- (11) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you. Anybody else who
- (12) would like to speak at this time? Mr. Margolis?
- (13) **MR. MARGOLIS:** My name is Eric Margolis. I live
- (14) at 3045 Timber Hill Court in Aurora, Illinois. I've
- (15) come here today to voice my concern and dismay over the
- (16) lack of compliance with the Freedom of Information Act
- (17) by the Township.
- (18) I had the opportunity in the last three weeks to
- (19) vote twice to the township offices and came away
- (20) wanting on both occasions. But for Mr. Donovan, I
- (21) would have come away with nothing at all. He was the
- (22) only one who knew where records were kept.

- (1) The Township is supposed to have, pursuant to
(2) Section 4 of the Freedom of Information Act, certain
(3) documents readily available, including a document where
(4) I can make a request for documents; and it has nothing.
(5) The person who was at the desk told me he was just
(6) there to answer phones. He had no idea where any of
(7) the forms were or any of the documents required by the
(8) Act.
(9) We're 25 years into the first amendment to the Act
(10) and two years into the second amendment, requiring
(11) certain documents be available on a walk-in basis, and
(12) the Township doesn't do it, and I'm unhappy. Thank
(13) you.
(14) (Applause.)
(15) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Is there anyone else who would
(16) like to speak at this time? All right. I'm not seeing
(17) anyone or hearing anyone. I'll give you one more
(18) chance, and then I'm going to close off the public
(19) forum portion of the meeting.
(20) All right. Now, at this point I'm going to
(21) announce that the 2014 Annual Town Meeting will be held
(22) on Tuesday, April 8, 2014, at 7:30 in here. Is that

- (1) correct, Stan?
(2) **MR. WOJTASIAK:** That's correct.
(3) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Did I read it wrong? It says
(4) the 8th on the agenda you gave me. I'm going with
(5) April 8th. I did read it right. Yes. Francie.
(6) **MS. CHIRICO:** I would like to make a motion to
(7) move the start time for the April 8, 2014 meeting to be
(8) held here at the Naperville Highway Department at
(9) 7:00 p.m. as opposed to 7:30 p.m.
(10) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** As a general rule, I would
(11) say, if that comports with the law, I'm going along
(12) with it. I don't know that the statute indicates a
(13) time. Is there a second to her motion?
(14) **MS. WEHRLI:** Second.
(15) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Francie, would you spell your
(16) name.
(17) **MS. CHIRICO:** F-R-A-N-C-E-S, C-H-I-R-I-C-O.
(18) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Where do you live?
(19) **MS. CHIRICO:** My address is 9S180 Skylane Drive,
(20) Naperville.
(21) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Janet.
(22) **MS. WEHRLI:** Janet Wehrl, W-E-H-R-L-I. 27W742

- (1) North Lane, Naperville.
(2) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** So it's been moved and
(3) seconded. Is there any discussion on the change of
(4) time? That means the meeting next year will be at 7:00
(5) unless, of course, it doesn't comply with the law.
(6) Then it will be whatever time the law says, but I don't
(7) think it says anything. Yes.
(8) **MS. SCHNEIDER:** My name is Cynthia Schneider. I
(9) reside at 912 Williamsburg Drive in Naperville, and my
(10) concern is for the time for when people get home from
(11) work to be able to make it in time for a 7:00 meeting.
(12) For some people, that would be difficult. So my
(13) concern is that it could cause some people to not be
(14) able to attend.
(15) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Is there any other discussion
(16) on the motion? Yes, sir. Would you state your name,
(17) please.
(18) **MR. GARAPOLLO:** Nick Garapolo, 30W104 Argyll Lane,
(19) G-A-R-A-P-O-L-O. I agree with the young lady. That
(20) extra half-hour would make a substantial difference,
(21) especially for people on trains.
(22) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** All right. Is there any other

- (1) discussion on this? Yes, sir.
(2) **MR. TUREK:** Fred Turek, 7S421 Green Acres Drive.
(3) I was thinking, when there is a bigger meeting, people
(4) really have to get there a half-hour earlier to make
(5) sure to get signed in and stuff, and it might be hard
(6) for people who work to get here at 6:30.
(7) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Any other discussion? I
(8) would, once again, ask you to hold up your hand with a
(9) yellow card if you are in favor of this motion, which
(10) is to change the start time from 7:30 to 7:00 for next
(11) year's Town Meeting. Please hold your hands up.
(12) Francie, are you voting for your motion?
(13) **MS. CHIRICO:** I didn't hear the question. I'm
(14) sorry.
(15) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** We're voting on your motion to
(16) change the time to 7:00. Everybody who wants to change
(17) the time to 7:00, hold your yellow card up. Is there
(18) anybody behind the Boy Scouts that's holding a card up
(19) other than Francie and the lady next to her? All
(20) right. Keep them up. I've got 10. All those opposed?
(21) Your motion fails. The meeting will be at 7:30
(22) next year.

- (1) Now, I would ask Ms. Millie Rodriguez to please
- (2) come forward.
- (3) **MS. RODRIGUEZ:** We just wanted to take a moment to
- (4) recognize and thank all of the elected officials that
- (5) have served in the past years and that will be moving
- (6) onto other things, and we would like to present these
- (7) on behalf of the Township in order to thank you for
- (8) your years of service and everything that you've done,
- (9) and we will miss you. So for the ones that are here.
- (10) Trustee May Yurgiatis.
- (11) (Applause.)
- (12) **MS. RODRIGUEZ:** Clerk Carol Bertulis.
- (13) (Applause.)
- (14) **MS. RODRIGUEZ:** Our Assessor, Warren Dixon.
- (15) (Applause.)
- (16) **MS. RODRIGUEZ:** And Supervisor, Gary Vician.
- (17) (Applause.)
- (18) **MS. RODRIGUEZ:** Thank you. Have a great evening.
- (19) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** Thank you, Millie.
- (20) (Applause.)
- (21) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** All right. Let's give all
- (22) these people who have served for so many years one last

- (1) those in favor of adjourning, please state aye.
- (2) (Chorus of ayes.)
- (3) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** We are adjourned.
- (4) (Whereupon, the meeting was
- (5) adjourned.)
- (6)
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- (1) round of applause.
- (2) (Applause.)
- (3) **MR. SCHILLERSTROM:** I guess I would be remiss if I
- (4) didn't thank Troop 81. Thank you, Troop 81, for coming
- (5) out and helping us, and at this time I would ask you to

- (7) **UNIDENTIFIED PUBLIC SPEAKER:** Point of
- (8) information, just in case somebody is out there
- (9) (Inaudible) --

- (13) to retire the colors and ask everybody to rise.
- (14) (Whereupon, the Colors were
